Time to get interactive "Rules" of the game

- 1. I am going to show pictures of birds in the list we just saw
- 2. Do not identify the birds shown until asked this will make it more fun for those who don't identify the birds as fast as you you can still participate by noting important things you see in the picture.
- 3. We will have two birds, left and right
- 4. Starting from the bird on the left you will be asked to
 - a. Type or (for those who are on their phones only and looking at a copy) say something about what you see. For example does it have markings anywhere? Where? Can you see wingbars? What colors are where?
 - b. After I say, you can type the species of the bird
 - c. We may discuss why we chose one ID over another
- 5. Then we will discuss the bird on the right (same process)
